USF orthopaedic residency is back...

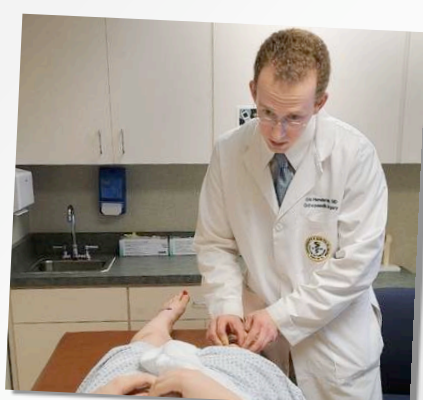
The Tampa Bay area and the University of South Florida are rich with Orthopaedic history extending back over twenty years since the existence of the original residency program. Prior to the first program's dissolution in 1990, USF Ortho was recognized as a top rated program, largely attributed to its former faculty members.

Phillip Spiegel, Roy Sanders, Tom Greene, Robert Belsole, John Rayhack, Thomas Bernasek, Jeff Mast, and David Leffers efforts designated USF as a lead producer of numerous works of orthopaedic research as well as device inventions and advancements. After its closure, many faculty members have remained in

the Tampa Bay area continuing the tradition of excellence in musculoskeletal care as well as research and education. Although the title of USF Orthopaedics remained dormant for some time, the infrastructure and rich resources needed to train residents was well maintained in the community...some would say a reincarnation was inevitable.

Since its return in 2007, USF Ortho has returned quickly to its roots of providing excellent clinical care and production of quality orthopaedic research. With the financial support of Florida Orthopaedics Institute, we have been able to create a dedicated 3-month biomechanical research rotation. In the past 3 years our residents have published over fifteen peer-reviewed papers and presented research in over twenty-five national and international meetings. Every year we have attracted top ten applicants and have averaged matching 4 out of our top 10 in the ACGME residency match for the past 3 years. 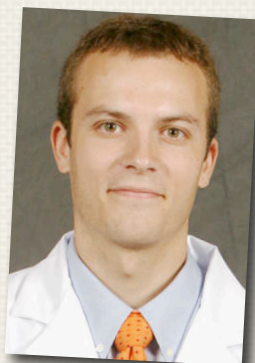
ANTONY DENARD

Establishment of USF Orthopaedic Resident Education Fund

In an effort to increase the educational opportunities available to USF orthopaedic residents, we have established the USF Orthopaedic Resident Education Fund through the USF Foundation.

We owe a special thanks to Dr. Ken Greene, who has donated his \$2000 honorarium to allow us to start the resident educational fund. 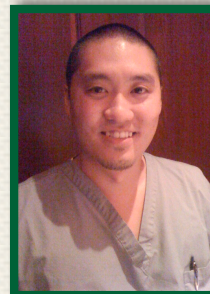
