






- 60% increase over the past 4 years
- Compares to annual U.S. increases of 1.0 to 4.8% during that period.












USMLE Step 2 CK Scores






CONTINUING COMMITMENT TO STUDENT SUCCESS


- > Phase 1: AY16/17 Technology built to enter data.




Quality Composite Score

- > 2015 Annual Quality Composite Score: -0.91
- > 2016 Annual Quality Composite Score: -0.20

CMS 5 quality performance domains:

- 1. Effective Clinical Care (ASA for ischemic vascular disease)
- 2. Person and Caregiver-Centered Experience and Outcomes (PG/CG-CAHPAS survey)
- 3. Community/Population Health (tobacco S&C)
- 4. Communication and Care Coordination (self: colonoscopy interval, melanoma referrals; claims: unnecessary hospitalizations for ambulatory sensitive conditions –pneum, DM, COPD, CHF)
- 5. Efficiency and Cost Reduction (antibiotics for sinusitis; amoxacillin)






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TGH & MCOM Elevating Care Together
